Tuition Fund Intent

Kingsbury Green Academy (KGA) will ensure no student's progress is negatively impacted by the extended period of school closure due to COVID-19.

Implementation of 16-19 tuition grant

The majority of the spend is directed towards students who have not secured maths GCSE at Grade 4 (2 students) or English language or literature at Grade 4 (1 student) in Year 11 but will also be used to support students who had not secured the GCSE English Language pass at 16 (2 students) and still require additional support in specific subjects. There are also 3 pupils in Year 13 who will receive additional subject support depending on need who did not secure GCSE passes in English or maths at the end of Year 11 but who secured these last year. There will also be support for our 15 economically disadvantaged students in transitioning into sixth form (10 students) and in making university/employment applications (5 students). These will run through invites to key skills workshops in KGA+ (enrichment) time. Table 1 shows the breakdown of planned spending.
